The Pastor's Report

Howdy folks!

I trust that these words find you safe and warm, and in the midst of that big winter project you've been "looking forward" to doing since the summer.

Now, enjoying my 18th year as a North Country resident, I feel a bit like a veteran when it comes to winter (that, plus growing up in Buffalo and spending two years dog-mushing in Minnesota). Suffice to say, I get winter. So, whenever I meet a person or family new to the community, I endeavor to offer the same bit of advice: "Pick a project!" Winter in this type of climate is not something with which you can go toe-to-toe. Meaning, you can't just slug it out trying to "get through it." One needs to find something to do, a winter project. Be it building a ship in the bottle, reading War And Peace, or cleaning out the basement.

Now, you realize the topic for this article isn't just coming out of the cold, thin air. So this month I encourage you to get after it! Come on, we'll do it together, it'll be fun.

Ghosts From The Past by Tyke Miller

In the **1956 February** newsletter we read: "February is the month of the beginning of Lent this year. Lent is the period of preparation for Holy Week, Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Traditionally in many churches, it is the time for the gathering in of new church members and the re-dedication of those already on the rolls of the church. The Session has tried to plan for both these conditions in providing a Lenten program. Certainly we cannot do too much to prepare ourselves once again to receive Jesus Christ crucified for us."

I feel rather sad that **Rev. Wells** did not include Maundy Thursday in his list of events to be remembered during Holy Week.

I was raised in the **Disciple Church**of Christ in Buffalo, N.Y. Holy Week of
course started with Palm Sunday. When
I was in 4th grade and 9 years old, my
friends and I went forward during the
"hymn of invitation" at the end of the
service to profess our Faith in Jesus
Christ as our Lord and Savior. This we
did after meeting with our minister in
class every Saturday morning during
Lent, from 9 a.m. to noon.

Then each night during **Holy Week** there was an **evening service**. Sometimes there was a visiting speaker and we children sat and listened with no toys or books of course.



Holy Thursday was the candlelight communion service. Very impressive! Good Friday evening included baptism by immersion of my class with my friends. At nine years of age, it was a little scary but Rev. Bridwell never dropped any of us.

Oh, I forgot. There was always a three hour service from noon to three p.m. on **Good Friday**. And Heaven help you if you had to go to the ladies room! No service on Saturday.

Easter Sunday my friends and I took communion for the first time. I remember it as if it were yesterday.

With children taking communion now at very young ages, I often wonder what memories they will have of their **first time experience** of having the Lord's Supper around the table with our Lord, Jesus Christ.

A Women of Grace Widows' Fund sponsored two-week trip in June **2016** is being planned to provide sewing training to the women in Mbowe, Malawi. **Ellen Grayson** of **Canton** and **Margot McGorman** of **Watertown**, both accomplished seamstresses, will train women (who in turn will train others) on **treadle sewing machines** to reinforce basic sewing abilities and teach advanced skills which can be used to produce clothing for their families and items suitable to be sold at the market.

Ellen and Margot will train 4 to 6 women who show aptitude and interest in sewing by cutting patterns and sewing simple projects to continually build skills and confidence. They also will instruct 2 to 3 women in business fundamentals to ensure that a percentage of the profits from the sale of these hand-sewn items at the market will be set aside to purchase additional supplies and fabric for a successful and sustainable sewing business. They also will work with all the widows in Mbowe to share simple sewing repairs that can be done by hand to extend the life of their clothing.

A **foot locker** is set up in the **foyer** of the church to receive **donations** of the following **sewing items**: sewing scissors, NEW thread - black, white and all shades of gray, hand sewing needles, machine needles - Universal (NOT ball point), #15 bobbins, bobbin cases, acrylic rulers - metric and inches, metric and Inches tape measures, straight pins - quilting, seam rippers, tailors chalk, snaps/snap tools, band-aids, reading glasses and tweezers.

You also can help by making a donation to cover the **costs of the trip** (including sewing machines, fabric, travel, food and lodging, and translation service). This trip is another step in our ongoing mission work in Malawi. **The generous support of the Canton Church is greatly appreciated!**
