



The Pastor's Report

Howdy folks!

As we move into March, we also find ourselves smack in the middle of the ecclesiastical season of Lent, or as it also known: The Easter Cycle. This month I though I'd give a little history on this unique aspect of our faith.

Easter is the oldest and greatest annual festival of the church. Like Passover with the Jews, it originally marked the beginning of the church year. It revolves entirely about the person and the work of Christ, being devoted to the great saving fact of his passion and resurrection.

The Easter festival proper was preceded by a forty days' season of repentance and fasting, called Quadragesima. This fast was an imitation of the forty days' fasting of Jesus in the wilderness, which itself was put in typical connection with the forty days' fasting of Moses and Elijah, and the forty years' wandering of Israel through the desert. At first a free-will act, it gradually assumed the character of a fixed custom and ordinance of the church. Pope Gregory I set the Wednesday of the sixth week before Easter, Ash Wednesday as it is called, as the beginning of it. On this day the priests and the people sprinkled themselves with dust and ashes, in token of their perishableness and their repentance, with the words: "Remember, O man/woman, that dust thou art, and unto dust thou must return; repent, that thou mayest inherit eternal life." 1

The English word **Lent** (stems from an Anglo-Saxon word for "spring" and is related to the English word lengthen) refers to the penitential period preceding Easter. Early Christians felt that the magnitude of the Easter celebration called for special preparation. In the early centuries, the season before Easter was also the usual period of intense training for new Christians. During this period, the catechumens (those learning what it meant to be Christians) went through the final stages of preparation for Baptism, which usually occurred at dawn on Easter Sunday. As the practice of infant baptism increased, the emphasis on Lent as a training period decreased. 2

Here on the Park, we certainly incorporate many of these historical aspects of Lent into our life and worship. However, instead of the notion of "giving something up" for Lent, we've tried to focus on "taking something on" for Lent. And, as Lent falls toward the end of our harsh winters (penance enough if you ask me!) we've also infused the season with moments of unique celebration: our annual "All Church Read," Celebrate The Gifts of Woman Sunday; as well as traditional Maundy Thursday, Palm Sunday and Easter services.

Blessings to you this season of Lent, Rev. Mike

Ghosts From The Past by Tyke Miller

As many of you know **I love history**. I find as I read and reread two of the books written about our **Church-On-The Park** I discover more information I either missed or don't remember.

Our church was founded on **March 6, 1807**. That means we are **214 years old** this month. WOW!! If only the walls could talk! Of course this is not the age of our current building.

Until **1816**, worship was held in members' homes until a schoolhouse was built on **Hodskin Street** which became the church's meeting place. The congregation continued to meet in the schoolhouse until **1831** when a church building was constructed on the location of the **present sanctuary**.

In **1826**, a decision was made to build the **first church**. The members "felt that they had spent sufficient time in wanderings, like the Israelites of old, and wanted a permanent place wherein God's honor might dwell".

It was not until **1830** that work was begun by members to actually start to build the first church where our present building now stands. Some time during 1831, the old church building was dedicated. You may see the old cornerstone on the wall of the hallway leading into the sanctuary.

"Members did not take lightly the vows and obligations of the Presbyterian Church in Canton. Joining the church was something more than a casual commitment. Duties were imposed by the minister and members of the Session, and church members were expected to 'embrace the Christian Life'.

Absence from the services was not

tolerated, and discipline, sometimes in the form of **excommunication**, was used to keep the church from criticism by the unbelieving world."

My, aren't we lucky times have changed?

Church School News

Winter Greetings from the crew below deck! My name is **Kim Trombly** and I am the **new Christian Education Director**. I live in Canton with my husband, **Lyles**, and two young children, **Noah and Julia**. Lyles and I became members of the church the same day our daughter, Julia, was baptized.

I grew up in Canton and have always had a **love of learning and teaching**. I taught 3rd and 4th grades at Norwood-Norfolk Elementary School from 2007 - 2011. I am grateful for this teaching opportunity within the Christian faith of the First Presbyterian Church-On-The-Park.

My first day in Sunday School was spent getting to know the children and playing ice breaker games. We went on an **imaginary picnic**, answered some questions on a **beach ball**, tossed **bean bags** to learn names, and we ended with drawing illustrations of what makes us **winners!** Our focus is going to be themed around a Christian cassette, **State of the Heart**, I used to listen to often in my childhood titled "**You Can be a Winner**"!

Children and teens need the reminder and reinforcement that **God is love** and that **everyone is a winner**. The first Sunday in February, the children traditionally made and baked the **bread** for Holy Communion. We had **9** young children and **4** older children getting their hands ooey gooey in the kitchen preparing the bread. It's a **wonderful tradition**!

The second Sunday in February was cancelled due to the extreme cold, therefore, we were not able to create Valentine's for the seniors in the nursing home. We will **replace** that with an **Easter gift** instead for this year!

I am looking forward to getting to know the children within the church community and sharing my gifts and talents.

Sewing Trip To Malawi

This June, **Margot McGorman** from Watertown and **Ellen Grayson from our church** will travel to **Malawi, Africa** with the express purpose of teaching **sewing**.

Sam Chirwa and Grace Chiumia, our coordinators in Malawi of the Women of Grace Widows' Fund. have selected **five** women to receive training in creating school uniforms. The women will be instructed in cutting, snap application, hand sewing and basic treadle machine operations. The women will also be instructed in repairing existing clothing. School uniforms will be sold at market with **profits** to support widows and children in Mbowe in addition to re-supplying the sewing room. In turn, women trained on the machines will then teach others to sew and eventually branch out into other sewing endeavors.

New **Singer treadle machines** cost approximately **\$200** each including oil and one bobbin. Each school uniform costs about **\$8** figuring the cost of material, thread and snaps. Machines and material will be **purchased in Mzuzu** and **transported to Mbowe**.

Supplies needed are snaps and snap tools, thread, new and not so new, straight pins, clear acrylic rulers, cloth tape measures. In addition, band-aids and reading eyeglasses are requested. There is a trunk set up in the foyer of the church for donations of these supplies.

The fund raising goal for this mission is \$10,000, which includes the cost of transportation and lodging, purchase of machines along with material and teaching tools. \$4,473 is still needed to meet the goal. **Donations are gratefully accepted.** Checks should be made payable to "First Presbyterian Church" with "Sewing Trip" on the memo line and sent to the church.


