Session Report

The Session meeting on **February 23rd** was called to order by Rev. Michael Catanzaro and **Elder Jane Fernandes** opened in prayer. Assistant Clerk of Session, **Sarah Melville** presided for Clerk **Wanda Renick**, who was unable to attend due to illness. New (returning) Elders **Armond Spencer** and **Barry Walch** were welcomed to the meeting, as they respectively agreed to open and close in prayer at the next meeting.

Rev. Mike expressed his **deep appreciation** for everyone's flexibility, support and prayers, as his mother's situation continues to be difficult.

Old business on the docket included further discussion of **committee leadership needs and structure**. The **Mission Budget** was revisited, but possible changes were tabled until further input is obtained.

A **membership class** was approved to accommodate people who have expressed interest in joining the church. **Prayers** were offered for **those in need**, with encouragement to send cards and letters. **New folks** coming to church were reviewed and the importance **welcoming** and speaking with them was noted.

The **2015 Ad Hoc Budget Committee**, created during the recent annual meeting, submitted a report that included a number of **cost saving ideas**; they will continue to investigate and expand upon ways to reduce overhead costs.

Session reviewed and approved calling **Katrina Hebb** as a volunteer, unpaid **Associate Lay Pastor**, akin to Donna Doig, whose terms of call were extended, as well. Congratulations to both Donna and Katrina, and perhaps even more so to the Church on the Park, so blessed to have them.

Elder **Mark Erickson**, chair of the Nominating Committee, brought up the need for

an additional Deacon. A Congregational Meeting is required to elect another Deacon; this will be announced two Sundays in a row and the meeting will be held after church, once a willing candidate is confirmed. *Note:* **Ann Spencer** graciously agreed to serve as a Deacon and was subsequently elected after church on March 8, 2015.

Committee highlights included reviewing the busy calendar of fundraising activities (spaghetti dinner, pancake breakfast and Lenten luncheon), noting that the manse furnace had required repair, planning for Communion to be administered and served by women in honor of Gifts of Women, and preparing for the One Great Hour of Sharing offering.

Rev. Mike thanked **Fred Pollard**, who has now retired from handling church finances, for his many years of hard work and service. The entire Session gave Fred a round of applause to express **sincere gratitude**, as the meeting was adjourned and closed with prayer.

Tenebrae Service

The word 'tenebrae' is Latin for shad**ows**. The purpose of the Tenebrae service is to recreate the emotional aspects of **the passion story**. It starts out with the church in candlelight, with as many candles as there are disciples, plus a white Christ candle. As scripture passages are read, candles are extinguished until only the Christ candle remains. Then someone reads the first part of **Psalm 22**, which Jesus quoted on the cross. Then the Christ candle is put out, leaving the congregation in near total darkness—and near total devastation. At this point, the service ends. There is no benediction and the people leave in silence.

The service is **left unfinished** because the story isn't over until **Easter**. Our Maundy Thursday Tenebrae Service is **April 2nd** at 7 p.m. in the sanctuary.
