Endowment

DO WE HAVE IT? WHAT IS IT? SHOULD WE HAVE IT? HOW DO WE BUILD IT?

I told many last year when I reported on the 2014 Stewardship Campaign, that my considerations of the needs of our congregation lead me to the same considerations that a family responds to each year – or even more often. There was (and is) the immediacy of securing pledge income that would assure continuation of our work & mission for 2015 in the face of the losses of several members of the congregation both to death and to various departures from the Canton area. This created a challenging situation that our congregation understands and has met this year with great generosity and sincerity, by the way! Thank you again. But, for me, there was also the recognition that, increasingly, our church community must rely, in part, on the wise giving of past members who made specific, thoughtful planned gifts in their wills specifying that funds be set aside in order to generate income to be used for specific purposes - in other words the income from our savings, our endowment. Our church must now rely on endowment interest income to meet our budget needs EVERY year. I believe this condition will continue for several years to come as our congregation -and our community—passes through a millennial change of sorts. In short, We do have **SOME endowment.** We are not endowed as a church of our age, mission and stature in this community should be.

What is it? The Endowment is a pool of funds gifted to our church to be held as income-generating capital for either a specific need or for the general support of the church, whichever is designated in the will or the gifting instrument involved. Most often this gifting is through an estate as specified in one's will or in a codicil to one's will. Such gifting must include instructions that the gift is to become part of the Endowment of the Canton First Presbyterian Church on

the Park. Such a statement instructs the estate executor to gift a designated portion of ones estate to the Church on the Park, and it can instruct the Elders to invest such bequests or gifts as general or specific endowment rather than to spend them to meet annual budget needs as memorial gifts often are used.

Should we have it? Every institution, be it church, college, public tv, public library, major orchestra, museum, etc., etc., has come to rely upon the resources gifted by their members as Endowment in their wills. There are surely many reasons for this reliance, but in our case two factors are primary, namely costs of keeping up our wideranging ministry and worship, and keeping our buildings so that they serve us and our community into the future. Ever since Silas Wright our congregants have believed that our church should be supported into the future by major gifts (endowment). The land on which the church rests was Silas Wright's gift to our future! The Sackrider Fund was another, and we have relied on it for both mission and upkeep expenses for many vears. I believe that we have demonstrated our responsible stewardship of these gifts for many years. Now, I believe not only that we should have an endowment, but that we must have endowment—perhaps two or three times the amount that we now have.

How do we build it? The Church-On-The-Park builds endowment by the thoughtful, planned giving of members of our congregation and by friends of the church who have made specific bequests that portions of their estates should be awarded to the Canton First Presbyterian Church. Consider the importance of your will and your wishes to the future of our church community.

abundant natural resources and remarkable landscapes through which each succeeding generation is blessed; including, now, my own.

Of course, the real challenge of taking a trip like this, or any such "mountain top" experience, is to carry over the

new experiences, growth and lessons learned forward into one's "regular" life. For myself, I've come to appreciate both the small joys of each new day and the virtue of taking the challenges of life's journey one day at a time; tomorrow will be here soon enough and low gear is a beautiful thing.

Ghosts From The Past

This month I am continuing on about the pastorate of the **Rev. Earnest E. Eells** as written in the Sesquicentennial booklet of our church in 1957. You might call this **Part Two**.

"Extensive work was done in the lower floor of the church in 1951. A new kitchen was installed and the dining room and a smaller room off the kitchen were renovated and made completely useful. We would be lost for our Sunday Church School and organizational meetings today if this work had not been carried on. Repair work of a thorough nature was also done in the manse in these years. Mr. Eells maintained an active organization throughout the church. He was constantly trying to serve the various elements of the congregation, and there are notes of dinners for college students and other such activities.

"Mr. Eels made what is probably the best attempt to solve the situation in regard to the Canton Church and its concern for the churches in the rural areas around the village. He preached and served as he could the churches at Crary Mills, Brick Chapel and Beech Plains. Finally, he proposed the organization of the Canton Larger Parish with the Canton Church as sort of a mother church. The four churches voted to join in such an organization, and a young man just out of seminary, the Rev. James Belt, was called to be associated with Mr. Eells in the work. This promising start was blunted by a series of problems, most of them arising out of misunderstanding between the Canton Church and Presbytery. Presbytery would not approve the plan as set up, and other difficulties arose with the result that the Brick Chapel Church never became actively involved in the program and the Canton Church soon felt itself to be left out.

Ghosts - continued

The Crary Mills and Beech Plains churches continue to be yoked as a two-point charge. Mr. Belt left after two years, but the churches are actively seeking a new minister."

When our family arrived in 1979 we remember attending Easter Sunrise Services at Beech Plains. I loved the design of the beautiful wood on the ceiling and walls. Then we would have breakfast at Brick Chapel, before attending the service at Canton. **Happy, happy memories!!**
