Family News

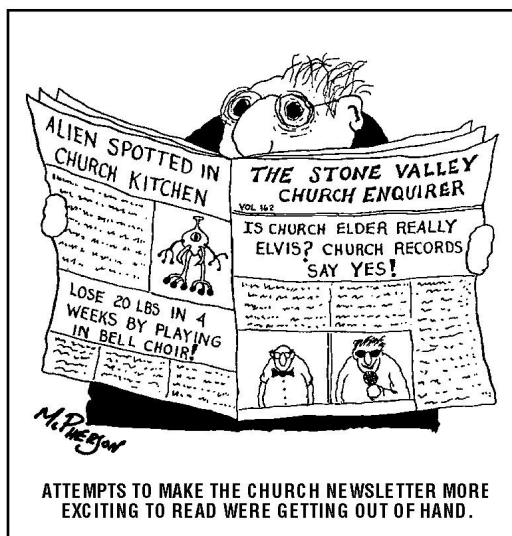

Youth Group News

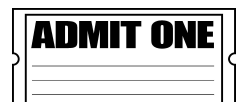

The Pastor's Report

Howdy Folks!

I hope you all had a sufficiently spooky and treat-filled Halloween, that you are planning to exercise your privilege and responsibility to vote, and are eagerly looking forward to Thanksgiving at the end of the month (which, as Bob Duda would remind us...) means Christmas is just around the corner.

I'd like to speak with you this month about care-giving. As many of you know, my mother Nancy Lyon suffered a significant stroke last January. On July 1st, after a great deal of rehabilitation and effort (mostly on Nancy's part), my brothers (Jack and Paul) and I decided to discharge her from the nursing home and make the attempt to care for her in our own homes on something of a rotating basis (with a great deal of help, of course).

After spending the first few months at Jack's house, Nancy and I are now in the third of our six week adventure living together at her house on Trout Lake in Hermon, NY (right next to my cottage). At Thanksgiving she will go to live with Paul and his family in Massachusetts; returning to Jack's house in February. **So far so good.**

The past few weeks with Nancy have been a remarkable experience; humbling, exhausting and immensely fulfilling. Through this, I have discovered a great deal about what it means to be a "care-giver."

First of all, **there is no faking it.** One either has within yourself the desire, love, affection and motivation to be a care-giver or one doesn't. If one does, you somehow find the strength,

means and determination necessary for the task. If one doesn't, you simply wouldn't make it over the long-haul and will have a miserable time of it along the way.

Second, there is no one "right" way to be a care-giver, and one isn't always going to get everything right (and certainly not the first time). Yes, one has to be safe and responsible, but beyond this one should assume themselves to be completely "out of the box." One does *what* one has to, *as* one has too, in order to get the job done. This isn't something one figures out at the front end, **it is a learning process that unfolds as you move through it.**

And, third, the reward for being a care-giver is unlike anything one would have ever imagined. Giving care to another is manifesting love in very real, and often humbling, ways. It is a task which is bigger than you are, but leaves you with so much more than you had when you started. **It is a blessing that returns home.**

By now you have realized, of course, that the lessons I have recently learned about "care-giving" apply very much to the notion of "stewardship"; as care-giving and stewardship are one and the same.

This fall, as we undertake our annual Stewardship Drive, I would ask each one of us to consider the desire and motivation we have to support the church, the creative ways each of us can do so, and the rewards we receive having offered to the church our gifts of time, talents, energy and resources.

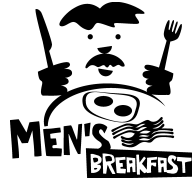

Tell Me About Mission

In October, Vicki McLain, a member of the Session talked about how mission works at our church and its impact. Many people asked that her message be shared in the newsletter so all can learn about it.

Stewardship is what we do after we say we believe. The church's Mission Budget is used in many different ways:

Through the **General Mission Giving** of the **Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)**, we help our neighbors in **our country** after natural disasters, and work to reduce poverty and hunger, combat injustice, guide youth in their walk with Christ, assist people with AIDS, addiction, domestic violence and help with child advocacy.

Outside the U.S.A., the Presbyterian Church has provided mission to advocate for human rights, to alleviate poverty and hunger, to evangelize, to build schools, to establish hospitals, to improve health care, to prepare native ministers, to translate Bibles, to advocate for education for women and girls, and to advocate for peace and justice.

Our church has been present in **Africa** since **1890** serving people in Kenya, South Sudan, Zambia, East Central Africa, Rwanda, Malawi, Madagascar, Ethiopia, Ghana and Niger.

In **Latin America** and the **Caribbean** since **1856** serving people in Haiti, Costa Rica, Brazil, Guatemala, Mexico, Peru, Columbia, Honduras, Nicaragua, Argentina, the Andes region, Bolivia and El Salvador.

In **Asia** and the **Pacific** since **1885** serving people in Indonesia, Thailand, Hong Kong, China, Southeast Asia, Japan, South Korea, the Philippines, Bangladesh, and Taiwan.

In the **Middle East** since **1871** in Egypt and Israel-Palestine. Also active in sensitive areas of China, Iraq, India,

Pakistan and Nepal.

Our church's mission budget is also used **locally**. Through the **Church & Community Program**, we help to provide food, clothing and assistance to families in our own area.

MINC (Ministry In the North Country) was established in 1989. Their motto is "Warmer, Safer, Drier". They are composed of volunteer church workers from all over the the Northeast, Mid-Atlantic and upper Midwest who travel each summer to replace windows, insulate homes, repair and replace roofs, build ramps for handicap access and complete other construction tasks for homes throughout the North Country. Several times our church has provided housing for these groups while they are in our area.

We assist our **sister churches** in the area; Brick Chapel, Crary Mills and Daily Ridge.

The **Pastor's Outreach Fund** allows Rev. Mike the flexibility to assist those who come to his office or home with needs. We also maintain undesignated mission funds so we can provide help in our community as it arises.

We support the **Women of Grace Widows' Fund** which is our joint international mission with the Watertown First Presbyterian Church which seeks to alleviate the extreme poverty faced by widows in Northern Malawi.

Finally, your mission funds are used to encourage and support students who are currently studying to become ministers at **seminary**.

Clearly, your mission dollars are hard at work, here and throughout the world, addressing needs and doing the work of the church.
